Federal elderly benefits, single seniors, 1985

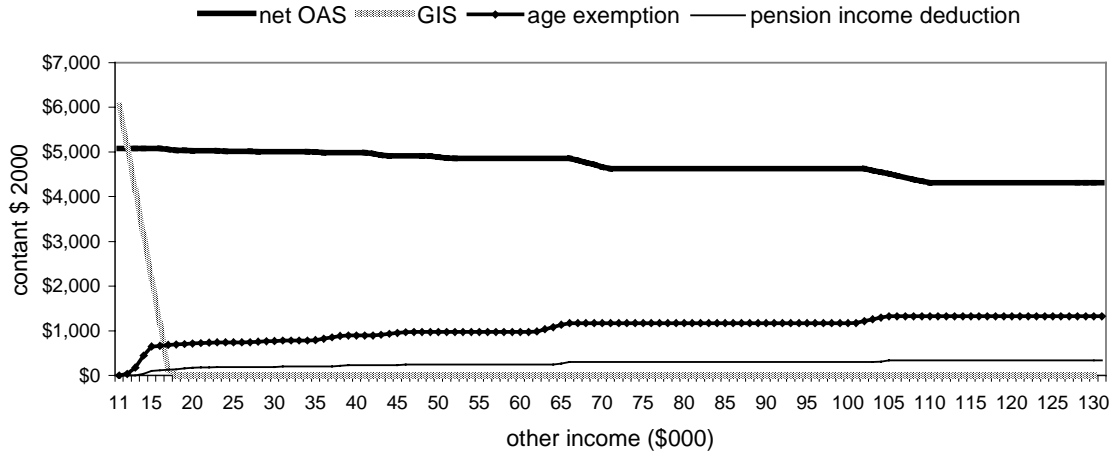

Total federal elderly benefits, single seniors, old (1985) and current (2000) systems

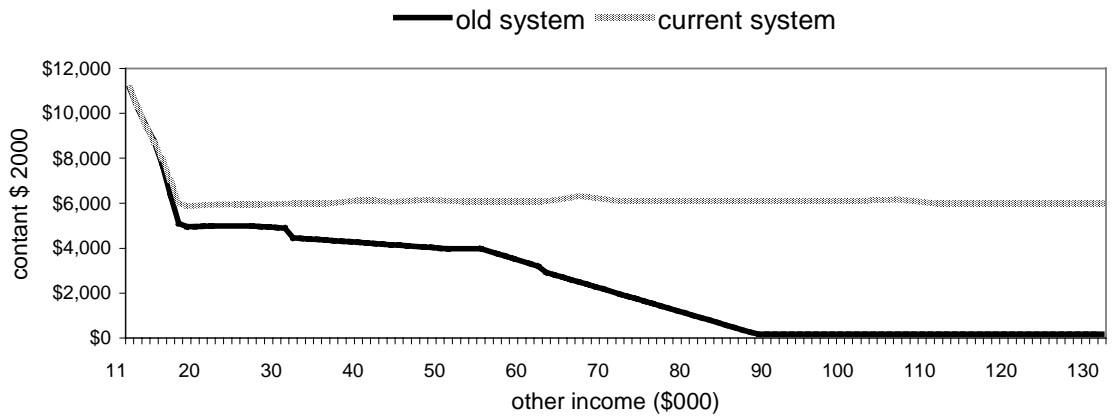

current system, 2000

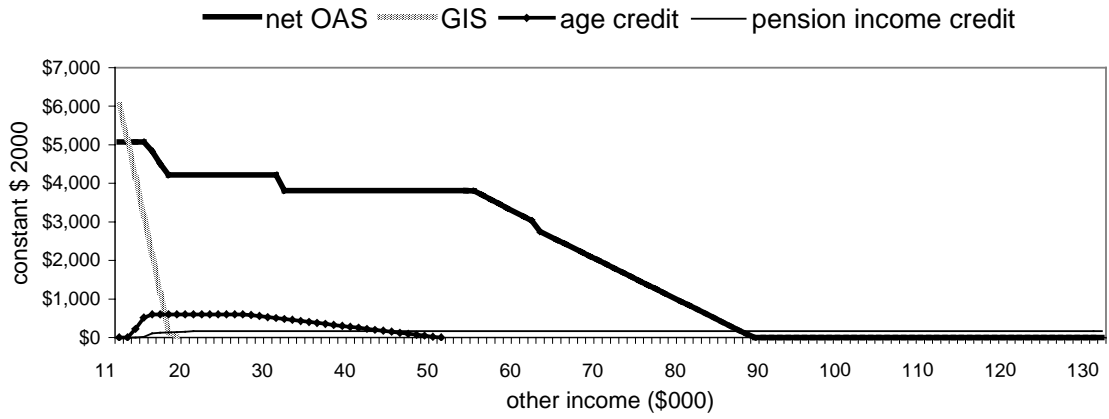

current (2000) versus old (1985) systems

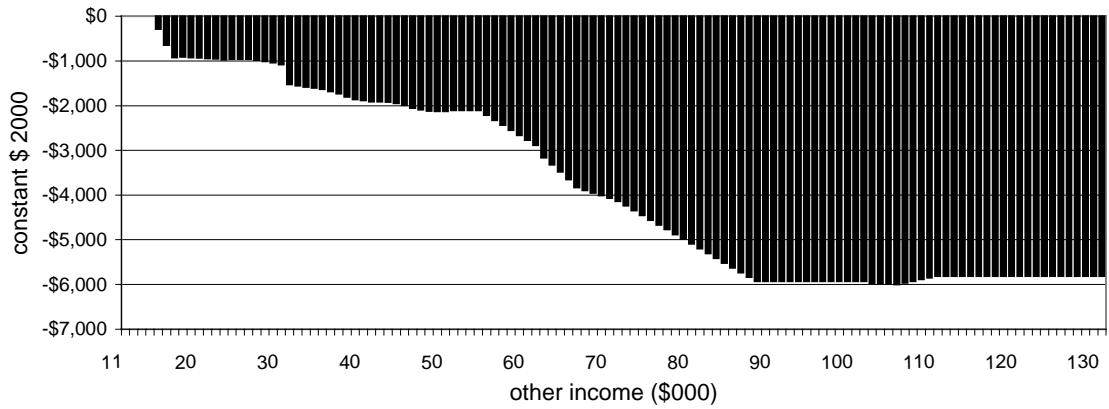

single seniors, current (2000) versus old (1985) systems

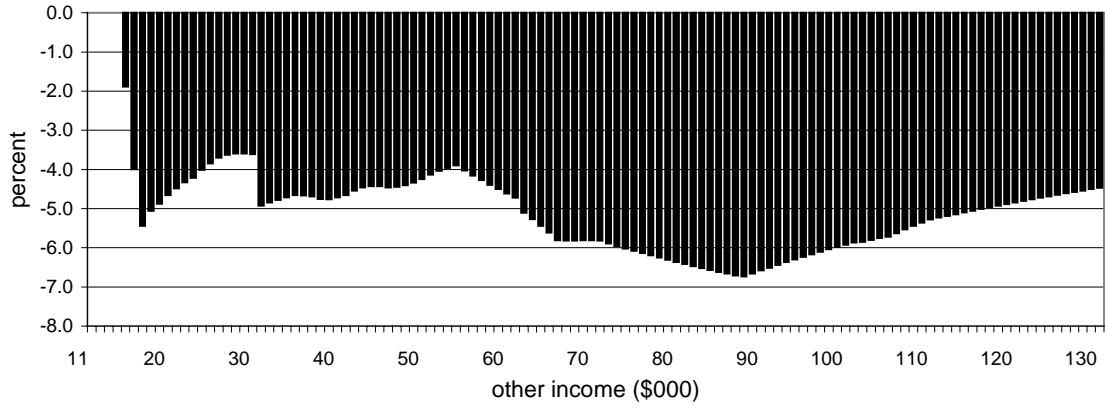

current system and proposed Seniors Benefit, 2001

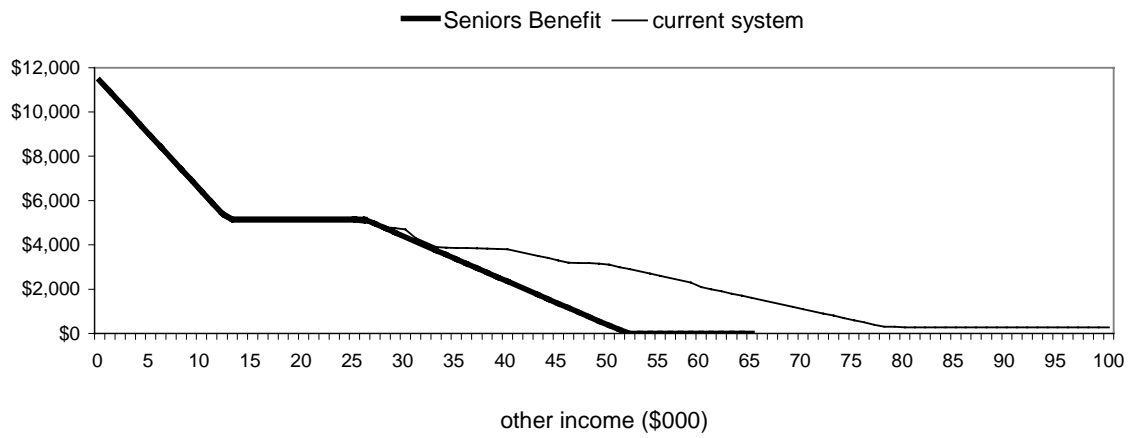

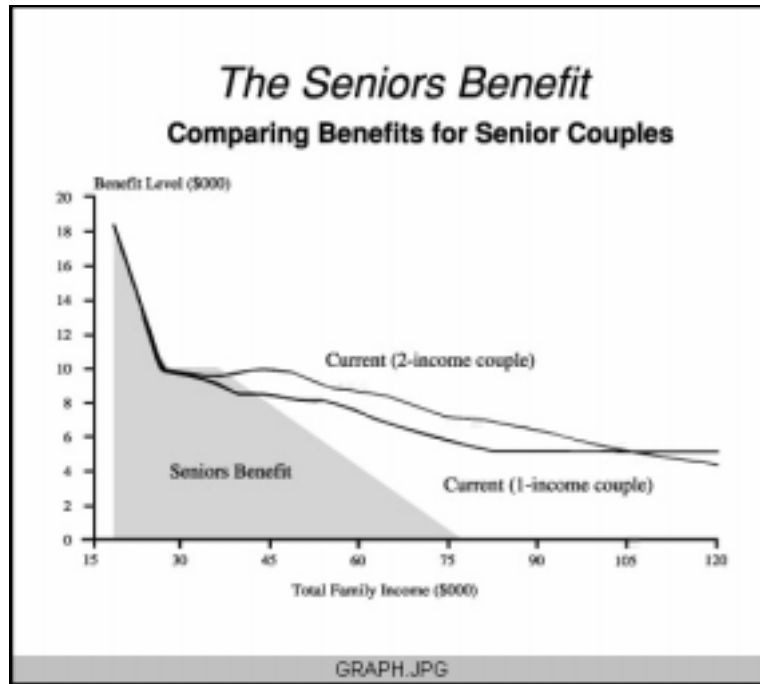

Seniors Benefit, single seniors, 2001

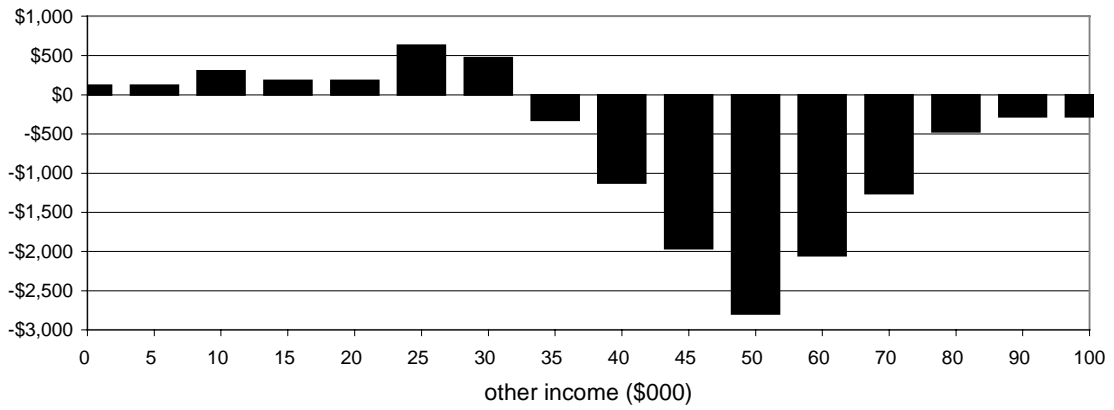

as % of other income, single seniors, 2001

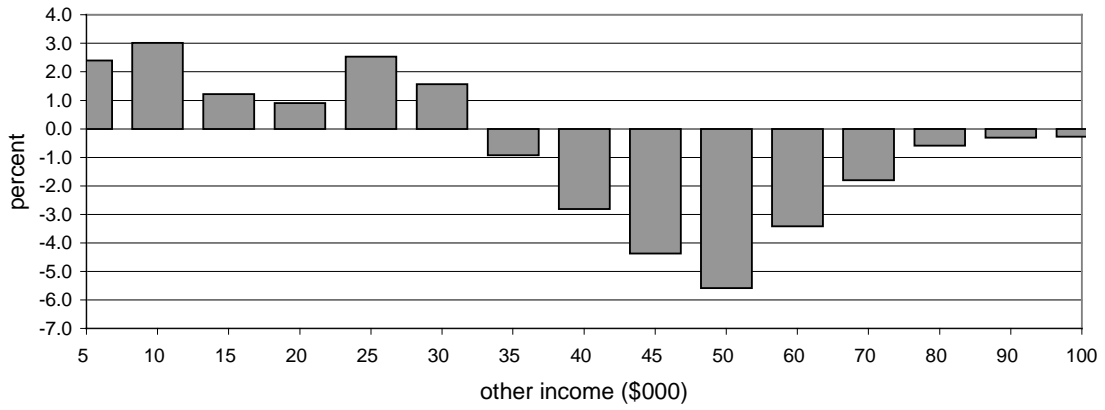

Seniors Benefit, one-income couples, 2001

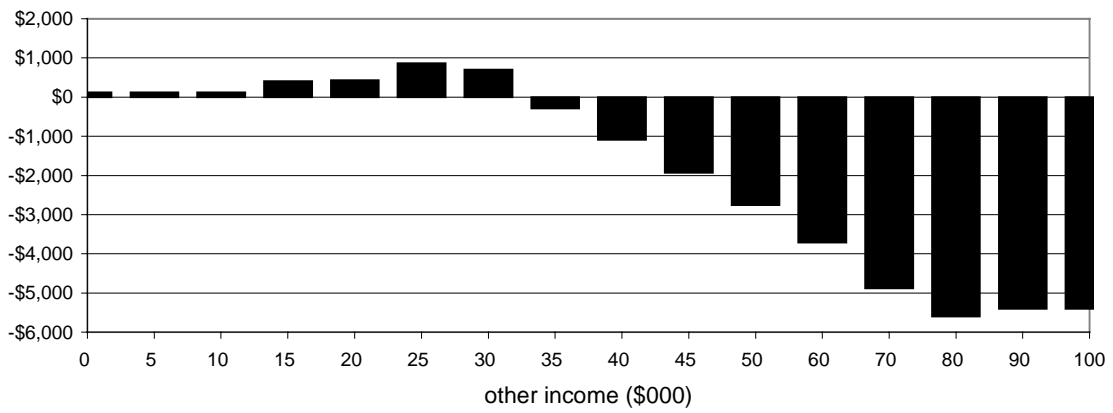

as % of other income, two-income couples, 2001

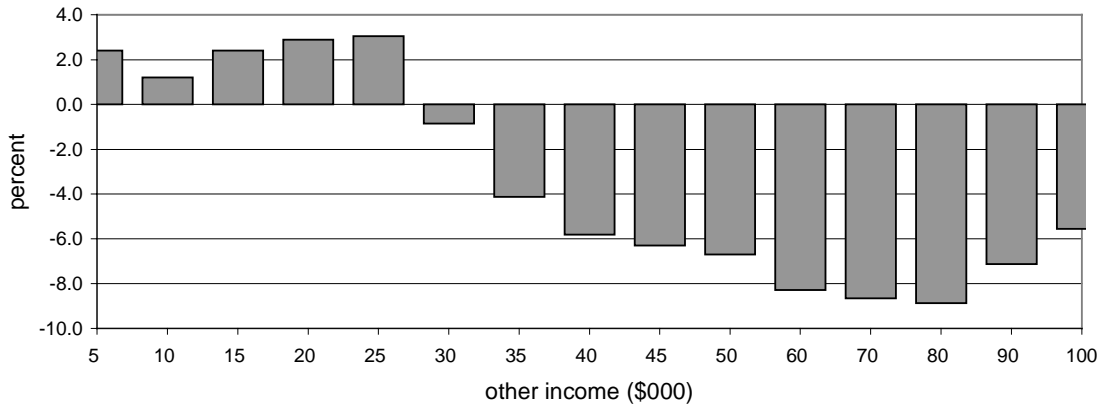

(OAS/GIS/SPA) as % of GDP, 1952-2100

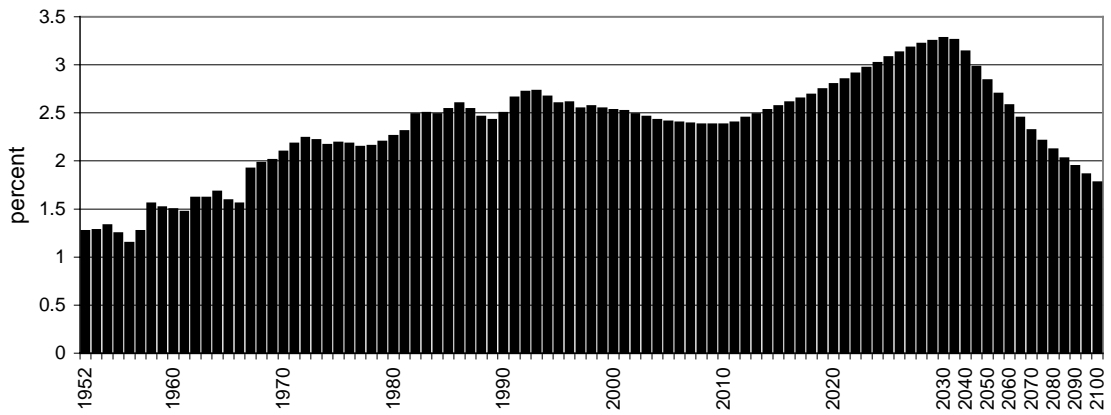

current system and proposed Seniors Benefit, 1997

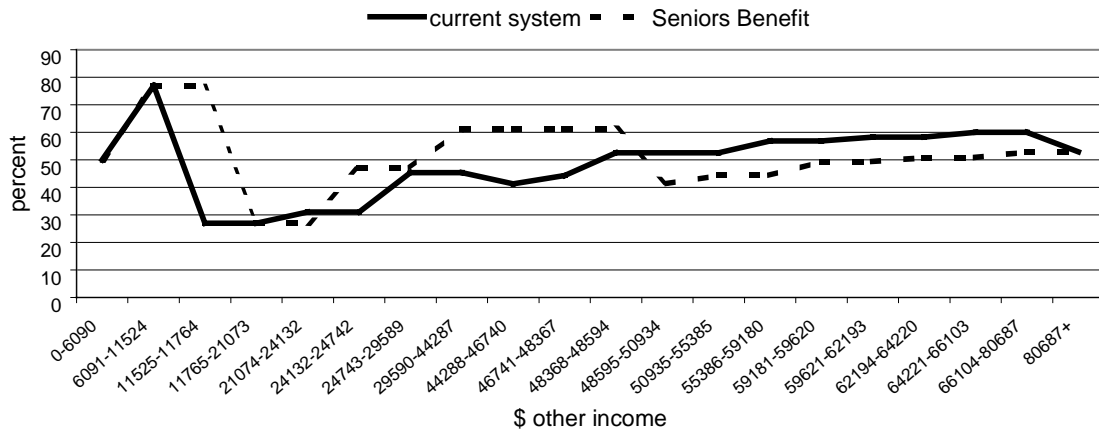

as % of other income, one-income couples, 2001

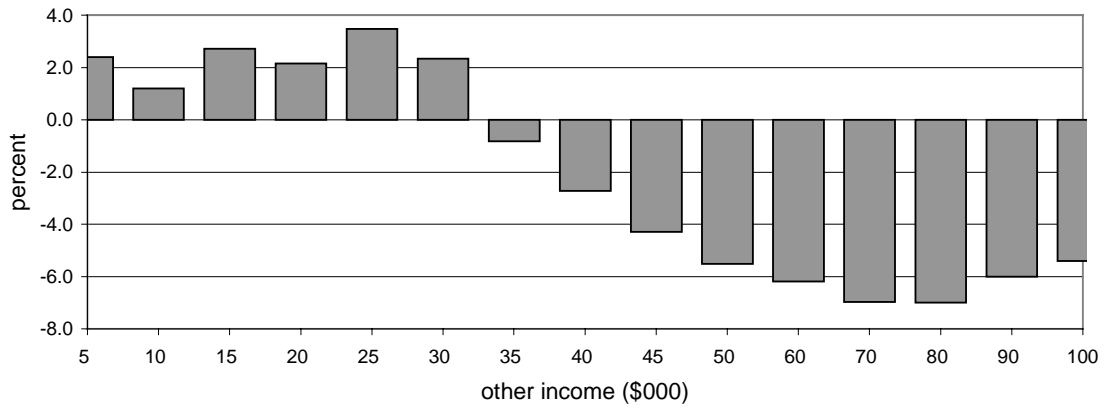
